












At our recent staff development day staff analysed the behaviour data collected from term 1. We identified a focus area of **Be Engaged** with an aim of re-teaching the behaviours using a consistent, whole-school approach with a common language in regard to positive behaviour expectations.

All classes have been presented with our focus area and have been working on this in their classrooms and play areas.

This focus area will be worked through and reviewed in week 5 following the review of behaviour data.



Being Healthy, Safe and Active Communicating and Interacting for Health and Wellbeing


Term 2 will see a focus on Protective Behaviours from Pre Primary to Year 10. The program will be delivered by Michelle Diver our School Chaplain and myself.

A Peek At What We Are Learning This Term Welcome to Term 2. This term is focused around the topic of Physics; while all classes are studying this area, it looks slightly different across the school.

Year 1/2 - Push and Pull. Through investigations, students observe and gather evidence about how these forces act in air and water, and on the ground. Students identify the effect of the pull of gravity and learn that both air and water can 'push'.

Year 3/4 - Heat and Forces. Heat can be produced in many ways and can move from one object to another. Forces can be exerted by one object on another through direct contact or from a distance.

>>>> Physics

Year 4/5 - Forces and Light. Forces can be exerted by one object on another through direct contact or from a distance. Light from a source forms shadows can be absorbed, reflected and refracted. Year 5/6 - Light and Electricity. Light from a source forms shadows can be absorbed, reflected and refracted. Electrical circuits provide a means of transferring and transforming electricity. Energy from a variety of sources can be used to generate electricity.

Middle School — Forces, simple machines, gravity, different forms of energy including kinetic, potential and heat energy, convection, conduction, radiation, transfer of energy, Newton's Law, the Law of Conservation of Energy
