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

Urban Indigenous. Students were engrossed to hear about the life of Sheila Humphries, who had been part of the Stolen Generation and grew up in New Norcia at the Benedictine Orphanage. Miss Sheila told stories of what her life was like before, during and after her time there; and showed the students some of her art work, for which she is world famous. The students asked some very interesting questions that were thoughtful and considerate.

After the talk, the students learnt about traditional aboriginal symbols used in paintings and drawings, and then helped to complete some large artworks using traditional colours and even native plants! The artworks are being reproduced on metal and will be hung on display at the school, so look out for them.
